Your reflective journal work should be an example of a flexible learning process where you evaluate your own progress and provide feedback related to acquired knowledge and skills.

How to Write A Reflective Journal in 30 Minutes ...

Gibbs Reflective Cycle model was developed by the American Psychologist and sociologist Graham Gibbs. He first introduced this model in his book "Learning by doing" in the year 1988. This nursing reflective cycle gives structure to learn from experiences.

This essay aims to critically reflect on an encounter with a service user in a health care setting. The Gibbs ' Reflective Cycle will be used as this is a popular model of reflection. Reflection is associated with learning from experience. It is viewed as an important approach for professionals who embrace lifelong learning (Jasper, 2013).

My Own Example Reflection Night Duty Drug Round Stage 1 – Description (Pure Facts) I was a third-year student nurse on night duty. A doctor asked me to give a patient 0.1 mg of Digoxin (a heart stimulant – steady, slows and strengthens the heartbeat) to a patient with congestive cardiac failure. I had never given this dose before and measured 4 tabs from the 0.25 mg bottle.
